2 'Single Moms' Need To Find Home For Their 'Kids'

BALTIMORE (WJZ) — With Mother's Day almost here, two hard-working, single mothers in Baltimore need your help.

Ron Matz reports they're caring for a lot of kids.

It's kitten season, and there are a lot of cats being cared for at the Maryland SPCA.

No cats are working harder than Kate and Allie, two single moms sharing the care of a litter of baby kittens.

"The Maryland SPCA took in the two single moms and their babies from the city's animal shelter, and we're hoping to foster them and find them a home. And that's what we're hoping to do for Mother's Day," said Aileen Gabbey, SPCA executive director.

The litter includes three males and two females. The kittens barely weigh a pound, and the moms and babies need a foster home.

Gabbey tells **Eyewitness News** a foster home will provide the kittens with temporary care.

"They're being really great moms. One mom takes care of feeding, the other mom takes care of cleaning up and socializing. They're really a great team," said Gabbey.

Last year 467 animals went through the Maryland SPCA's foster program. Nearly all of them were kittens.

"At this time of year, the Maryland SPCA and other area shelters really do get full with cats and kittens. It's warmer outside, more kittens are born. It's a tough time of year," said Gabbey.

"We really need help. We need help to foster and care for those animals so we can save lives, and then help to place them up for adoption once they're of age," said Katie Flory, volunteer and foster manager at Maryland SPCA.
